From the EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

s Prince George's Child Resource Center enters its seventeenth year, we have taken time to reflect on all we have accomplished. Did you know that each year the Resource Center provides family support services to over 7,000 families and training to over 4,500 child care providers, parents and human services workers? We estimate that we have touched the lives of nearly half a million children since we began in 1990! Our core commitment to empowering families has yielded the following outcomes in recent years:

- 93% of parents who participate in our Family Support Center improve their literacy skills and 91% of children improve their cognitive and language abilities.
- 90% of child care providers rate workshops as excellent and say they plan to use information gained in workshops to improve their early childhood programs.
- 98% of children in our Healthy Families Program reach developmental milestones as indicated by the American Academy of Pediatrics.
- 85% of teen parents receiving our LOCATE child care referral services stay in school.

These concrete successes are encouraging, and with your help we will continue to strive for a community where all children are nurtured in strong and stable families. We are so grateful to the Meyer Foundation for awarding us a *Management Assistance Program* grant. With this funding we were able to hire a consultant, Catalan deMatties, who is guiding us as we navigate the world of fundraising, marketing and development. We now have a Development Department with Jennifer Hoffman as the Director and Yenny Lucero as Development Associate. Jen and Yen (hard to resist) inaugurated this new department by celebrating Mother's Day. Within this newsletter, we detail not only our generous donors, but the women that meant so much to them. Thank you all for your support of the work that we do. We could not do it without you!

And one last note ... we always knew that the Resource Center is a great place to work. Now it has been confirmed. The Resource Center has been awarded the 2007 Workplace Excellence Award from the Alliance for Workplace Excellence. We have always emphasized the importance of supportive and family-friendly personnel policies for our staff members. We want to thank the Alliance and let them know that it is wonderful to be recognized for our efforts.

o you know of a child in your child care program that is exhibiting challenging behavior? Have you tried almost everything? Is expulsion the next step? STOP!!!

There is HOPE ... keep the child, but lose the behavior. The Prince George's Child Resource Center is pleased to announce the launching of **Project WIN** (*Wise Identification Now*) Early Mental Health Consultation Project. The project will address the mental health needs of children age birth-to-five enrolled in child care programs. Project WIN is funded by the Maryland State Department of Education/Office of Child Care and partners with Bowie Therapeutic Nursery Center.

Project WIN's service is <u>FREE</u> to child care providers and includes:

- telephone consultations for child care providers,
- site visits by project staff conducting observation,
- technical assistance to enhance environments,

- assessment and diagnosis (if necessary),
- referral of children to agencies as needed,
- training for parents and providers, and
- follow-up technical assistance.

If you have concerns about a child's behavior or social/ emotional well-being, contact the Resource Center today. With Project WIN, we all can win!



School Age TRAINING

he Resource Center is pleased to offer six new school-age trainings. These six hour training modules are part of a grant from Maryland Committee for Children and the Maryland State Department of Education, Office of Child Care, and are being offered at the extraordinary price of \$25 for each six hour workshop. The topics are:

- School-Age Care and Homework Assistance: Meeting Needs and Finding Balance (curriculum, child development and community)
- Developing Life Skills for the 21st Century (curriculum, child development)
- **Developing the Whole Child** (health, safety and nutrition, curriculum, community)
- How to Grow a School-Age Child (child development, curriculum)

- Family Portraits (community, professionalism)
- Building A Dynamic School-Age Program (professionalism, curriculum)

There will be a total of 36 hours of training developed that will be offered in a variety of formats: a six-hour training, a-one day workshop or as two three-hour sessions. I can even bring the training to your worksite. The trainings are geared to intermediate and advanced providers, but will be appropriate for everyone. In order to receive a certificate, participants must attend all six hours of each training module – and if you take all 36 hours your certificate will be gorgeous! housands of young children in Prince George's County are taken to child care each day, as parents go to work. Each year they diligently work to bring a high level and well-received professional conference to Prince George's County. This year participants noted on evaluation forms that they appreciated the workshops, gift bags, breakfast, lunch and entertainment. The Committee is already at work to bring another outstanding event in 2008!
