



Taming the Tiger in Your Program

How can I get my students to stop hitting each other? No matter what I say they just keep bothering each other during circle time! I don't know what to do and I'm getting ready to suspend a child for running around the room! These are just a few of the common concerns that we hear from childcare providers all over the county. No matter the age, children need much more support for remembering the rules than adults do. Just think about how many speed limit signs are along the highway (there's one about every ten minutes) and we adults still have trouble following the rules! Even though the children in your care may be able to repeat the rules when standing directly in front of you, they may not be thinking of the rules when they are happily engaged in play or suddenly frustrated by a peer. One thing we can all do is use positively worded rules in the classroom. Tell children what they can do instead of telling them to stop doing something. For example, a good rule for children is to "Use walking feet inside the classroom." This tells children what to do instead of telling them not to run, hop, crawl, etc. In addition to using positive language to describe the rules, use pictures of real children engaged in the behavior that you want to repeat.

Look at Me! I Wrote My Name!

Learning to write their names brings joy to young children. Scribbles are the first stage of writing and should be encouraged with children from as young as twelve months. By the age of two, many children have the muscle control needed to use a writing tool. Young children need a print rich environment and daily opportunities to move along in the stages of writing.

Learning to write is a complex task and involves both motor skills and critical thinking skills. Building prewriting skills can be done in many different ways, not just with pencil and paper. Build skills by using manipulatives that help build the small motor skills, eye hand coordination, and the visual coordination and perception needed to hold and use writing tools. Provide writing materials in all learning centers, and let children enjoy their writing experiences. Praise their writing and resist the urge to correct mistakes. Display their writing just as you would an art project. For more information on helping children become writers, join us for I Can Write My Name!
