

# 28% INCREASED BIRTH POPULATION

While a 28% growth in the birth population is great news for UMCRH, for Family Connects Prince George's the rate of increase resulted in a need to increase program capacity in order to meet Family Connects International Key Performance Indicator of providing a home visit to 60% of the birth population.
