MOVE-EAT-LEARN – A New Program at the Resource Center

We are entering the 5th month of the Resource Center's yearlong celebration of our 25th anniversary with a special announcement about a new project. Thanks to the Amerigroup Foundation, we will launch a pilot program working with child care providers that will focus on increasing exercise and improving nutrition. The select group of providers will then be able to teach children and their families all they have learned. This first group of 25, both from group and family child care, will work with us and our partner, Joe's Movement Emporium.

We call the pilot MOVE-EAT-LEARN. Committed participants will come together regularly to enjoy evenings that combine fun movement activities with nutrition education. Each evening will end with a light meal to share. We hope this will foster good habits, a strong knowledge-base, and, even more importantly, a shared experience that will grow into a positive support group. Most of all we want everyone involved to have fun!

Our goals for the pilot are that providers will:

1. Set personal goals to incorporate healthy habits into their daily routines;
2. Improve nutrition by assessing and addressing both their own meal selections and those served to children;
3. Increase the number of minutes that movement opportunities are programmed into daily curricula;
4. Share newly-gained knowledge with the children and their families, and
5. Become healthy, fit and reduce their stress.

Maryland EXCELS

The Resource Center will continue to support child care providers as they enter and advance in Maryland EXCELS. Our staff will work closely with Sheila Maness and Vickie DiSanto, the MSDE Quality Assurance Specialists assigned to Prince George's County. Support groups will be held at PGCRC on February 10 and 20, March 9 and 19, and May 11 and 21. A two hour professionalism training, Next Steps in Maryland EXCELS, will be offered at 6:30 p.m. on May 25.



Plan Your Professional Development

Maryland State Department of Education recently initiated several training requirements; most providers will be affected by one or more of these requirements. Plan ahead so that you meet all the training deadlines.

Including All Children and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

This class must be completed by all family child care providers, including assistant teachers in large family homes, and all child care center directors, teachers and assistant teachers. PGCRC is offering this class on February 20 and 25; March 12 and 24, April 28 and May 19.

Medication Administration

This six hour training is now required for all family child care providers. Class size is limited to 10 and each participant is required to pass math and reading tests before being allowed to take the training. Classes are offered on February 27, March 19, April 2 and 9, and May 14.

On Track: All Aboard for Developmental Progress Overview

This four hour class will be required for all family child care providers, center directors and lead teachers in child care centers.

Supporting Breastfeeding in Child Care

Staff in any program approved for infant and toddler care (group and family programs) must complete approved training in supporting breastfeeding in child care. PGCRC offers a one half hour session that fully meets the training requirement. A continued training certificate is issued to all participants. The training is offered February 20 and 23, March 12, and April 16.



Tools of the Trade II Sessions 1-6: Afterschool SET (Science, Engineering & Technology) Ready for Life

This series provides an introduction to the Afterschool SET Ready for Life Checklist and elements for high quality SET programming in afterschools. Understanding the relevance of science, engineering and technology and the language of math in afterschool settings and how these complement each other is the focus of these six sessions. In a fun and hands-on way, learn which SET abilities 21st century kids need for success and how your program can support the development of these skills. There are six 2-hour sessions that will be listed throughout the training calendar under the core of knowledge Curriculum. At the completion of all six sessions you will have earned 12 hours of training.
