A MESSAGE FROM MARIELA


Hello!

MILESTONES THAT HAVE EMPOWERED WOMEN HISTORY OVER THE YEARS

These events are just a few examples of the many milestones and achievements of women throughout history. Women's History Month is an opportunity to recognize and celebrate these contributions and to continue working toward gender equality.

- 1. March 3, 1913: The Women's Suffrage Parade takes place in Washington, D.C., with over 5,000 women participating in the march for the right to vote.
- 2. March 22, 1972: Congress passes the Equal Rights Amendment, which would have guaranteed equal rights under the law for all Americans regardless of gender, but it was never ratified.
- 3. March 16, 1984: The first Women's History Week is celebrated in the United States.

International Women's Day is important because it is a day dedicated to celebrating the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements of women. It is also a day to reflect on the ongoing struggle for gender equality and to advocate for women's rights.
